BRIDGE MINISTER'S COLUMN: The Rev. Dr. Joseph David Stinson

"But when it pleased God..."

Paul in his letter to Galatian Christians (1:15) lets us in on a secret of our Christian life. We think God will speak to us only in a certain way, in a certain place, under certain circumstances. In reality God might break in at any moment, in unexpected ways. How are we to know when and where? Paul was certainly not expecting an encounter with Jesus while he made his way to Damascus. Nor would he have expected it would become his calling in life to be instructed to take Jesus and his message to the Gentiles. Nor would the Christians in Damascus have expected their sworn enemy to become a convert and one of them. God is so unpredictable!

Normally when a minister talks like this the message is "to be open to change." Though I'm new to you and Centre Congregational Church, that is not my message to you. Rather my advice is to draw near to God, become familiar with God, study the teachings of those who knew Jesus first hand, and, above all, pray regularly. Otherwise we are likely to miss the surprises of God. We must expect and look for those moments when God comes into our lives. Perhaps on a Sunday morning, perhaps not. Perhaps at work, around the dinner table or in the dark of night



when we can't sleep. If we strive to keep our relationship with God faithful and constant, we are more likely to find God's surprising power breaking out all over the place.

This is a good message for Lent, that time of preparation for Christians and churches as we approach the great season of Easter. Lent is the time I'm arriving as the bridge pastor between Bert Marshall and whomever it is God will call to be your next minister. There will, no doubt, be surprises for all of us. That's the way God works. I hope and pray my work among

you for the next few months will be to help you draw closer to God and our faith, that we both may discover what is the plan of God for each of us and for this church.

One of the opportunities I've planned is a brief course on Jesus' *Sermon on the Mount*. We'll read together these teachings of Jesus that Matthew collected and preserved in chapters 5-7 in his gospel. The class will last seven weeks, so this will take us past Lent into the Easter season. It will give me an opportunity to get to know some of you better and for you to get to know me. Look elsewhere in this newsletter for details about the class.

I look forward to my first Sunday with you on **March 4**. I will be in the office and Brattleboro each Tuesday and on call the rest of the week for emergencies. 
Greetings to all,

This section of Jesus' teachings is one of his most famous, having motivated and influenced St. Francis, Leo Tolstoy, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Gandhi, and Martin Luther King, among others. John Stott, the Anglican priest, wrote that the Sermon is a brief statement of "a Christian value-system, ethical standard, religious devotion, attitude toward money, ambition, life-style and network of relationships—all of which are totally at variance with those of the non-Christian world."

At the time Matthew's gospel began to circulate, the church was living in the Roman world. The standards of Jesus and the church are still profoundly counter cultural in our own time and place. Come and delve deeply in to the challenge of living as a follower of Jesus. Participants should bring a Bible and a bag lunch to each class. A syllabus of reading assignments will be available on the table in the hallway outside the offices. For more information, please call the church office.


