The Mission and Service Board is responsible for identifying and supporting agencies and organizations in our community, our denomination, and beyond that are aligned with our church's mission. This publication lists the groups our church is currently supporting.

AIDS Project of Southern Vermont—provides direct services to those whose lives are affected by HIV/AIDS. They also offer education about HIV/AIDS to help prevent its spread, and to promote understanding within the community.

The Boys and Girls Club of Brattleboro — enables all young people, especially those who need them most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens.

Brattleboro Affordable Housing's mission is to improve, increase, and preserve housing affordable to low-income people in the Brattleboro area and to do so in a ways that are sustainable, collaborative, and empowering, and that raise public awareness of local housing needs.

Brattleboro Centre for Children—a day care and pre school program for infants and young children located in our building.

Brattleboro Area Drop In Center—is a day shelter open to all persons. It offers a welcoming atmosphere, community food shelf, and support services.

Brattleboro Pastoral Counseling Center—provides non-sectarian pastoral counseling, psychotherapy, couples and family therapy at moderate costs. No one is turned away for lack of insurance or income.

Brattleboro Summer Lunch Program—Provides a nutritious noon time meal for children at several locations during the summer.

Brattleboro Area Walk-in Clinic—provides primary medical and dental treatment to persons regardless of their ability to pay and serves as a referral resource for the community and other service organizations.

The Doves Project—a project of the AIDS project of Southern Vermont. Centre Church serves as a collection site for specific items for families effected by HIV.

El Cristo Redentor—our sister parish in El Salvador. We support one another through prayers, correspondences, pictures, and visits.

The Food Basket—a project of the Brattleboro Area Drop-in Center. Center Church is a collection site for non-perishable food and household items that support the services of the Drop-in Center.

Heifer International—works with communities to end hunger and poverty and care for the earth. Through hand-ups rather than hand-outs, Heifer provides gifts of livestock and trainings world wide.

Loaves and Fishes—provides hot meals every Tuesday and Friday. This "soup kitchen" is located in our building.

The Luz Del Mundo Scholarship — provides scholarships for children in our sister parish in El Salvador, enabling them to attend school. By staying in school children are more likely to end the cycle of poverty in which they live.

The Nell Sather Scholarship Fund—provides a summer camp experience for children attending schools in the Windham Southeast Supervisory Union.

Overflow Shelter—Provides a hot meal and overnight shelter to homeless in Brattleboro during the winter months. In addition to financial contributions Centre Church members prepare and serve a meal at the shelter on the fourth Sunday of the month.

Partners in Service (PINS) - is agency of the state of Vermont that partners faith communities with agencies of human services to promote resiliency and success of children and youth who have been victims of abuse and neglect. Centre Church is partnered with our local office of the Department of Children and Families. In addition to our financial support we provide space for meetings and events.

Centre Church Peace and Justice Committee—is a committee of our own church that is tasked with supporting issues and events related to peace and justice.

A Moment for Peace—takes place during Gallery Walk on the first Friday of each month. This interdenominational service brings individuals of a various faiths together in worship.

Global Ministries is responsible for nurturing relationships with international partnership on behalf of the United Church of Christ and the Disciples of Christ. Centre Church is partnered with a missionary currently serving in Guatemala.

Star Island Scholarship—Provides camp scholarships for Centre Church youth to attend Star Island, a summer residential camp of the United Church of Christ.
